English	English Language Paper 1: The focus is creative reading and writing and expects you to demonstrate your ability to read fiction and write fiction.	Section A Reading (50% of the marks) 4 questions based on one extract which is a narrative Section B Writing (50% of the marks) Choice of two tasks: You are encouraged to do the story. You are assessed on the quality of the plot and the language devices/ structure devices used to tell their story, writing in paragraphs is essential. You are additionally assessed on the SPAG which also includes the quality of the vocabulary you use, the range of punctuation you use and the variety of sentence forms that you use to make the story more interesting.
	English Literature: Macbeth and A Christmas Carol	Thesis statement that contains the ideas/ themes that are present in the text and relevant to the question and the writer's intentions 3 key moments in the main body of the essay that relate to the beginning, middle and end and best demonstrate the theme and character identified in the question. One of these key moments will be provided in the question but they need to include two others with quotes if they can and they need to explore the moments and the ideas that are presented. An overall conclusion that goes back to the question theme and the writer's intentions.

History	Paper Two- Health & the People and Elizabethan England	Students could be asked a range of questions on Health & the People topic but as we haven't finished the Elizabethan England topic questions will only be on what has been taught to students so far.
Geography	Paper 1 + 1 unit from paper 2	The exam is 1hr 45mins and contains questions on the three units you have covered in Year 10 - Natural Hazards, The Living World and Physical Landscapes. You will need to revise: Tectonic Hazards Climatic Hazards Climate Change Ecosystems Tropical Rainforests Cold Environments Rivers Coasts. At the end will be a set of questions from Paper 2 on the Urban Issues unit that we have just completed in lessons
